

OVERWEIGHT CONSUMER FOOD AND POWER SECTORS STRATEGY:

UNDERWEIGHT TELCO SECTOR

Volatility in the US continues to remain heightened as investors weigh policy moves in the US. After giving up all their gains 2 weeks ago, both the Dow Jones index and S&P 500 are less than 1% away from their all-time highs as of Friday. However, it is also important to note that despite what is happening in the US, countries that have cut rates this year have seen their

equity indices marching higher. Germany is up 22% for the year and Japan's Nikkei is closing in on the 20,000-point level. Australia is also up 10% despite weak commodity prices.

The PSEi is no exception, with the index less than 1% away from its all-time high. Since the start of February, despite the wild swings in foreign markets, the PSEI has traded in a tight, 150-point range.

While equities still remain resilient, we are closely monitoring the strong dollar. The peso hit a low of 44.95 last week against the dollar before pulling back from resistance of 45. A sharp depreciation of the peso past the 45-level may cause equity prices to weaken.
